

RICHARD PORTER

Richard Porter is Professor of Mathematics and Special Assistant on Experiential Education to the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Northeastern University in Boston. He is Program Director of the Institute on Global and Experiential Education hosted by the World Association for Cooperative Education. Rick has served as Chair of the Mathematics Department and as Vice President for the Division of Cooperative Education at Northeastern University.

He received his Ph.D. in Mathematics from Yale University. Rick has given invited lectures on his mathematics research throughout the country and Europe. He has been visiting professor at the Université des Sciences et Technologies de Lille, France and at the University of Sussex England.

Rick has given talks and workshops on experiential education at meetings of the National Commission for Cooperative Education, the World Association for Cooperative Education, the Cooperative Education and Internship Association, and the Association of American Colleges and Universities. He is co-director, with James Stellar, of a Research Lab of undergraduate students who conduct research, write papers, and give presentations on student learning through various forms of experiential education.

In his role as Vice President for Cooperative Education, Rick oversaw the Departments of Cooperative Education, International Cooperative Education, and Career Services. During his time in this role, U.S. News & World Report ranked Northeastern University number one in the country for programs that combine classroom learning with real-world experience. In addition, Northeastern's Department of Career Services was top ranked by Kaplan/Newsweek's "Unofficial, Insider's Guide to the 320 Most Interesting Colleges and Universities,"
