CALL FOR ABSTRACTS!

For the 16th World Conference, there will be TWO WAVES for Call for Abstracts.

First Wave: April 30, 2008 - June 30, 2008

Second Wave: September 15, 2008 - December 15, 2008

There is a "Rolling Review & Acceptance" for submitted abstracts. By mid-February, 2009, everyone who has submitted an abstract will be notified.

We will be accepting abstracts from the following four categories:

I. Concurrent Sessions

- a.) Papers 15 minutes + 5 minutes Q & A.
- b.) Refereed Papers 15 minutes + 5 minutes Q & A.
- c.) Panels 45 minutes + 15 minutes Q & A.
- d.) Workshops 2 Options: 45 minutes + 15 minutes Q & A or 120 minutes = double session.

II. Round Table Sessions

Two 1-hour sessions, two different days. Specific topics (i.e. Assessment, Accreditation, Working with Faculty, Industry Partnerships, Service Learning, etc.) will be identified for each Round Table and will be facilitated by one or two individuals.

III. Poster

Two 1-hour sessions in large room, two different days. Each Poster Presenter will prepare a poster which describes a program, new initiative, etc. Delegates will walk around the room visiting these stations.

IV. International Dialogue Sessions

If you have ever wanted to present at a World Conference but not as a refereed or research writer/presenter, try an International Dialogue Session, a series of three or four short (roughly five-to-seven minutes each) presentations that are grouped together because the presentations share a common theme and/or focus. The individual five-to-seven minute presentation will consist of four (maximum) Power Point slides which will highlight your theme/focus or begin a WIL conversation you would like to start.

Dialogue Topics for International Dialogue Sessions can include:

- Faculty Engagement
- Assessment
- International WIL Program Development
- Accreditation
- Student Engagement
- Cooperative Education
- Service Learning

Each presentation will run five-to-seven minutes, with four presentations grouped (by a common theme) at one time, in a 50 minute slot. Therefore, presentations will run 28-30 minutes, allowing the remaining time to be for Q & A (for all four presentations at the conclusion of all).
